


Modbury School Preschool to Year 7 Community Code of Conduct



Introduction

At Modbury School Preschool to Year 7 we are very proud and fortunate to have a very dedicated and supportive school community. At our school, we recognise the importance of a partnership between staff, Governing Council, parents and carers in the education of children.

As a partnership we are all aware of the importance of good working relationships and all recognise the importance of these relationships to equip our children with the necessary skills for their education.

Expected behaviour and conduct

Parents, carers and visitors are asked to:

- Respect the caring nature of our school community and support our core values of Connect, Challenge and Create;
- Work together positively and constructively with teachers and staff;
- Treat all members of our community with respect;
- Set a good example in their own speech and behaviour;
- Raise concerns about the school through the appropriate channels, so they can be dealt with fairly, appropriately and effectively for all concerned.

Behaviour and conduct which is not tolerated

- Disruptive behaviour which interferes with any of the school's normal operation;
- Threatening a member of staff, a visitor, another parent, carer or child in any way;
- Damaging or destroying school property;
- Sending abusive or threatening messages to anyone within the school community, this includes all forms of communication including social media;
- Making defamatory, offensive or derogatory comments regarding the school or a member of the school community on social media sites;
- Verbally or physically aggressive behaviour towards a member of the school community;
- Approaching someone else's child because of the actions of this child towards their own child;
- Smoking, taking illegal drugs or consuming alcohol on school premises
- Bringing dogs onto school grounds

Responses to breaches of the Code of Conduct

- Communicate with the parties involved
- Issue a warning letter
- Issue a 24-hour ban or another prohibition
- Or ultimately, referral to the police
